### **Grant Details:**

### 1. Jeux Canada Games Foundation.

### 2. Canada Post Grants

### Small project grants (up to \$5,000)

Project grants are project-specific and cannot be used for general funding. Eligible projects should increase the capacity of an organization and create or expand services, rather than maintaining existing services. Examples: playground equipment, park upgrades, library supplies, after-school programs, etc.

### **Organizations eligible:**

Schools (as defined by the Education Act in each province)

School/parent organizations

Note: Playground equipment is only eligible for a small project grant (\$5,000 and under).



### **Financial documentation requirements**

Grants up to \$5,000 require minimal financial documentation. We require a project budget and financial statement for the current year. Applications from schools or school parent councils may include their current school board budget.

### Literacy

Academics New IA hired for Kindergarten (Mme C.) and French language monitor M. Jeremie with us until January.

A few registrations are still trickling in; 328 students currently enrolled.

Grades 4, 6 and 8 are completing a French writing assessment this month and Grades 3 and 4 are completing a new math assessment. Grades 1 and 2 will be completing a French reading assessment. The results of these will help guide instruction as we get further into the year.

We have been examining trends and target areas for our students based on last year's assessments; improving literacy and writing scores remains a goal for our school improvement plan. Some great news however:

### **Overall Performance Standing Distribution**




K to 4 (French language/ literacy):
