Quality Relationships RCSD Trustees along with Director Sean Chase and area superintendent Stacey Gherasim visited last Friday;

Huge response to invitation to book 3-way conferences;

Grade 4 students spending the day at Trinity Manor (collaboration with CTK, Marrick and the home)

Grade 8 teachers were approved for a wellness grant through SaskTel to support kindness/ mental health (Grade 8 outdoor ed trip)

Before and After School program through the YMCA- continues to meet the needs of our families. Must decide if we will endorse and contract this service for the 2025-2026 school year by April 21 st .

Student survey: results from the fall-

- 1- students reporting positive sense of belonging went from 50% to 67%;
- 2- students reporting positive relationships went from 70% to 92%;
- 3- Students reporting experiencing anxiety decreased from 36% to 24%;
- 4- Students reporting depression decreased from 31% to 16%;
- 5- Students who reported having an understanding of their own culture went from 38% to 59%;
- 6- Students who reported having a general, positive sense of life satisfaction went from 64% to 95%
- 7-Students who feel safe attending this school went from 43% to 75%;
- 8- Students who reported feeling bullied decreased from 42% to 17%
